# Minister's Thoughts

It is two months since I posted thoughts here – two months that none of us will forget. We have been shut down the entire time, and expect that distancing is our new normal. Although some businesses and activities will reopen soon, we do not expect physical church at UUFD will be among them. Much of our congregation is at higher risk, and our normal church life does not readily adapt to social distancing. When we do gather, we like to gather with hugs, touches, singing, and all kinds of sharing. To be safe from ourselves, and to protect those we love, church will continue to be internet-based for a while – probably a long while.

As hard as this reality is, I must say that our Zoom services feel wonderful, and temper the pain of distancing. For me, it is heartwarming to see and hear most of you on Sunday mornings, each of us in our own little box on the screen. It reassures me when you report that you are well, and it includes me when you express difficulties. We care deeply for one another, and this simple way of staying linked keeps the bonds of our very special community strong.

This experience reminds me that community is really the essence of our church. It would be easy to find a more polished UU church service production on the internet, but it is the personal connection to those in our own Fellowship that warms our hearts, feeds our souls, and holds attacks of loneliness at bay. And so many thanks to the Worship Associates and other helpers that deliver services to us week after week. And thanks also to everyone else that is helping do the work of the church and keeping the blessings of our community vital, even as we adapt and learn to do it all in a new way.

This pandemic brings a tangle of insecurities, fears, and difficulties. For some, it is inconvenient, for others it is threatening and scary. Let us do what we can to hold each other up in these times and respond to one another's needs. Let us make sure that those of us who shelter alone are never really left alone. From what I see, you have all been doing this very well. Pandemic is a challenge, and coping with it is an important new life skill – but we also

should remember that it is not life.

Do what keeps you flourishing. We are all finding new ways to engage our interests and to use our time, ways to keep ourselves healthy and going and growing. I have a long list of things I had once relegated to doing “someday” and am now attacking and accomplishing, albeit gradually. I’m also trying to engage in regular exercise and set aside time for contemplation and spiritual work. But we all do our own thing – books, crafts, movies, nature, learning, music, gardening, cooking, home repairs. Just stay active, busy, and engaged.

I hope to offer some new opportunities for activities at UUFD, so watch the weekly e-news. And, of course, keep coming to church – we all want to see you, we all need to see you, and some of us need to be seen. Let us continue to be wise, to be careful, and to be wary for our health and the health of others. Go forth, as always, trying to be your best self. We will persevere together.




## Book Talk

First and foremost I would like to thank Arthur Shimkus for his donation of the book *The Experience of God: Being, Consciousness, Bliss* by David Bentley Hart. Reviews of the book found it engaging, bracing and bold. It will soon be added to the library collection in the Religion section, and can be checked out when available.

Second, I would like to propose some changes to the procedure used to place books new to the library on the shelves. As each book is added it is stamped with a special UUFd stamp showing ownership. A checkout folder and card are placed on the inside of the front cover complete with author and title. Then two additional cards are prepared, one with the author (last name first) with additional information, and the other with the title and additional information. These cards are filed away in separate file boxes, and both are in alphabetical order. Library users can use these to determine if a book is owned or in the library. Over the years, which I would estimate to be from approximately the early 1960s, this procedure has been used. However, some cards do not follow this procedure and many errors result. For example, when books are withdrawn, sometimes the card remains in the author/title files. Sometimes these cards were overlooked in adding new titles. Some cards are misplaced for various reasons. In short, a significant number of cards are out of line with the books. There is no indication that any effort was made to correct the cards overall, which admittedly would be a time-consuming effort. Another observation is that the author/title cards are seldom used. As libraries go, the UUFd library is a very small library and the books are divided into approximately twenty subject headings. Pursuing one or two related subject areas for a book or author is quite simple.

I propose the practice of creating only the circulation card for books new to the collection. The current cards can be eliminated. If there are concerns, let me know. If I don't hear of any alternate suggestions in about a month, I'll put the new procedure in practice.
